Introduction of the Induction Program

Due to the pandemic, the academic year (2020- 2021) started in the month of November (2020) for 3rd and 5th semesters through offline/online mode simultaneously. However the classes were conducted through offline from December 2020. The class work for the newly admitted students commence from month of February 2021. Due to Covid second wave, Sri Venkateswara University has given instructions to conduct online classes from 5th May 2021. The commissioner ate of collegiate education (CCE) also instructed the lecturers to conduct online classes and do live recording of the classes. Besides the respective Information like Topic, student's attendance and video links of the everyday classes were uploaded in the Bharadpadhe online and LPMS in CCE website. Also the Lecturers had shared the video links of classes to the students who were not able to attend the classes due to network issues.
