Celebrated SAMVIDHAN HATYA DIWAS

SMT.N.P.S.GDC (W) CHITTOOR

DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE and HISTORY

“Samvidhaan Hatya Diwas”

To commemorate *Samvidhaan Hatya Diwas* on 25th June 2025, as per the directions of the Government of India and the Higher Education Department, by organizing meaningful and educative activities to:

- Recall the imposition of the Emergency in 1975.
- Pay tribute to those who suffered and resisted during the Emergency.
- Promote democratic values and the protection of constitutional rights.

Here's an elaboration on each of the three points you've mentioned regarding the Emergency period in India:

1. Recall the Imposition of the Emergency in 1975

The Emergency was imposed in India on **June 25, 1975**, by then Prime Minister **Indira Gandhi**, under **Article 352** of the Constitution, citing "**internal disturbance**" as the reason. It lasted for **21 months**, until **March 21, 1977**. During this period:

- **Civil liberties were suspended.**
- **Press freedom was curbed**—newspapers were heavily censored.
- **Political opponents** of the ruling government were **imprisoned** without trial under the Maintenance of Internal Security Act (MISA).
- Parliament was reduced to a mere formality, and constitutional institutions were weakened.
- The government launched controversial programs like **forced sterilization** and **slum demolitions**, causing severe distress to the common people.

This period is considered a **dark chapter in India's democratic history**, as it undermined the very essence of the Constitution and fundamental rights.

2. Pay Tribute to Those Who Suffered and Resisted During the Emergency

Despite the climate of fear and repression, many **brave individuals** stood up against the authoritarian rule. These included:

- **Political leaders** from opposition parties who were jailed, such as **Jayaprakash Narayan (JP)**, **Atal Bihari Vajpayee**, **L.K. Advani**, **George Fernandes**, and many others.
- **Journalists and editors** who fought against censorship and continued to report the truth covertly.
- **Students, lawyers, civil society activists**, and **ordinary citizens** who risked their lives and freedom to oppose the tyranny and uphold democratic values.

Their courage and sacrifice helped **preserve the spirit of democracy** in India. They are remembered as **guardians of constitutional integrity** who refused to submit to injustice.

3. Promote Democratic Values and the Protection of Constitutional Rights

The Emergency taught India a powerful lesson — **democracy is not just a form of governance but a value system** that must be protected and nurtured continuously. Key takeaways include:

- The **importance of civil liberties**, such as freedom of speech, expression, and dissent.
- The **vital role of an independent judiciary**, press, and civil society in checking government overreach.
- The **need for citizens, especially the youth**, to stay informed, vigilant, and actively participate in democratic processes.
- The recognition that **constitutional rights** like the right to life, liberty, equality, and personal freedom are not negotiable and must never be compromised under any circumstance.

Observing days like **Samvidhaan Hatya Diwas** (Constitutional Murder Day) serves as a **reminder to future generations** that **eternal vigilance is the price of liberty**. It reaffirms our collective commitment to uphold the Constitution, protect human rights, and strengthen democratic institutions.

Program Highlights:

1. Morning Assembly Address: The Principal addressed the staff and students about the historical context of the 1975 Emergency, emphasizing its impact on democracy and constitutional rights. The speech highlighted the courage of individuals who opposed authoritarian rule and protected democratic values.

2. Awareness Lecture: A special lecture was conducted by, Department of Political Science and History, titled “*Emergency 1975: A Threat to Democracy*”. The session educated students about:

- Events leading up to the Emergency.
- Suspension of fundamental rights and press freedom.
- Role of judiciary, opposition leaders, and civil society.
- Lessons learned and constitutional safeguards.

3. Documentary Screening: An informative documentary on “The Emergency: India’s Darkest Phase of Democracy” was screened to sensitize students about the real-life experiences and consequences of the era.

4. Poster Display and Slogan Writing: 20 Students from various departments prepared posters and 15 Students participated in a slogan writing activity reflecting themes like:

- “Democracy Must Be Protected”
- “Safeguard Our Constitution”
- “No to Authoritarianism, Yes to Liberty”

Outcome:

The observance successfully fulfilled the objectives set forth by the Government. Students gained insight into the importance of constitutional values, democratic rights, and the dangers of autocratic governance. The program inspired participants to remain vigilant and proactive citizens in a democratic society.
